



## **Briefing Paper - Alignment with ReNew, supporting the CEEC and the Alliance**

In the current landscape – gospel need, challenges and opportunity – Yarnton is seeking to change the culture around training through enabling and funding.

An important expression of enabling is gospel partnership among evangelical Anglicans, Independents and Others around a uniting focus on multiplying gospel workers.

In this context, recognising the challenges faced by evangelical Anglicans, Yarnton is committed to supporting ReNew, the Church of England Evangelical Council (CEEC), and the Alliance, to work for a future for evangelical Anglicans in and outside the Church of England.

CEEC is leading evangelicals in the Church of England to engage in meaningful action to achieve meaningful structural provision. From the outset of the present crisis in the Church of England, CEEC has been clear and consistent in its advocacy – without action there will be no structural provision, and therefore no future for evangelicals in the Church of England.

Meaningful action takes many forms. Enabling a movement that will mobilize the emerging generation of leaders is a positive, powerful and unifying expression of meaningful action. It is attractive to evangelical leaders and churches as positive action. It galvanises and draws in the next generation of leaders. It ensures that the emerging generation of leaders is not lost to the Church.

Yarnton is convictionally complementarian, and will therefore support people training on the alternative complementarian pathways in the Church of England that constitute meaningful action to achieve meaningful structural provision – currently Ebbsfleet and Reach South Africa – and with the training pathways in Gafcon’s Anglican Network in Europe (ANiE).

Yarnton will not support people who receive funding for their training from the Church of England.
